## **SAVE** This spring, do a little "sprinkler spruce-up" to properly maintain your irrigation system and reduce water waste.

- Conduct monthly, two minute per zone inspections to identify and adjust any sprinkler heads that are spraying water on pavement.
- Adjust irrigation controller settings to water infrequently (up to twice per week in July and August) and deep into the soil by using the cycle and soak method to promote strong, drought resistant roots.
- Water in the early morning or evening to reduce evaporation.
- Install a three inch layer of mulch around plants to retain soil moisture.
- Replace portions of unused turf grass with native and drought tolerant plants with help from Texas Smartscape: www.txsmartscape.com.
