

History

- Types of Texas Cities
- Texas Constitution's home rule amendment (1912)
- First term-limited council: Paris, Texas (1948)
- U.S. presidents (FDR): 22nd Amendment (1951)
- City charter push in 1980s
- By 2010: Over 40% (147 out of 351) have term limits
- 2019: General law city legislation




Practice

- State preemption: Substance v. form of government
- Council-manager form of government (89% of home rule cities)



Most Significant Outcome of the Council-Manager Plan in Texas
