WHEREAS, after receiving a business degree from Sam Houston State University in 1967, Bill entered the United States Army where he obtained the rank of First Lieutenant and did a tour of duty in Vietnam and was awarded the Army Commendation Medal; and

WHEREAS, after concluding his military service, Bill had a long, successful career in the healthcare industry; and

WHEREAS, Bill has been active in Republican politics since 1976, serving as precinct chairman, election judge, poll watcher and on the credentials and platform committees for the senate district convention and the credentials committee for the state convention; and


