





Parks/General	There aren't gray plus signs on the map. Village Creek linear park trail is a priority because my husband was one of the four cyclists that was riding when they were struck by a vehicle where Alan was severely injured and Steve was killed. They always had to get off the trail at Village Creek to get to the Woodland Park neighborhood on the south side of 303.
Fire/Public Works	Very disappointed that 2 projects not included: Firestation #10 on SW Green Oaks (it is a blight on our neighborhood - ratty roof, etc.) and rebuilding sections of SW Green Oaks that are endlessly repaved with asphalt (Bowen to Park Springs, Kelle Elliott to Overland Stage). There is no excuse for this after 20 years of no improvements.
Public Works/Parks	Projects I'd like to see: Leader Overland West (Matching Grants) new park development and water pad, location: Dangerfield Rd, other cross street Little Rd.; 2. Cameron Dr, Crest Dr. 76017 paved, Aldi Parking lot Emergency huge pot hole, can destroy driver tire and cause severe accident damage, Thank you, Arlington, TX for your considerations.
Public Works	Is widening roads a wise choice when that added impervious surface will only increase flash flooding? Also is the expense worth the safety risk it will increase speeds leading to more crashes? Use more of that money to increase the sidewalk program. Also I would appreciate an itemized vote on the intersection improvements. Are dedicated right turn lanes a safe choice? They increase the opportunity for pedestrian crossing conflicts. Signal ITS improvements, sidewalk program (\$10 million is too low, Arlington has way more need that that), and safe routes to schools plans should be a top priority.

Public Works	Streets and residential rebuilds
Public Works	Need for bicycle paths in Southwest Arlington
Public Works	Improve Medlin Drive from downgrading by big water trucks for fracking companies. Those trucks & other big trucks use Medlin as a shortcut to avoid part of S Cooper Street.
Public Works	The remainder of Saddle Ridge Rd in Shorewood need to be redone due to construction trucks damage due to other streets being redone.

Public Works	Melear road needs to be replaced! Paisley Drive & Canongate Drive need to be replaced due to 18 wheeler trucks in & out working on Gunn Jr High for the last 3 years!
Public Works	Where is the extension to build Pleasant Ridge to Bowman Springs?
Parks	Kids need improvements not dogs.
Parks	The Bowman Springs Park playground needs to be on the list for new playgrounds. It needs to be bigger and better! Arlington spent half a million dollars to redo the parking lot at Bowman Springs Park and left the pitiful little playground with no improvements besides some new wood chips on the ground. It's beyond sad!
Parks This comment was submitted 7 times.	As a resident of Arlington and participant of North Arlington Little League, we urge the committee to consider a capital project for improvements to J.W. Dunlop Sports Center (1500 NW Green Oaks) to include the construction of a regulation sized baseball field with lighting in the location where Orange field stands today. The construction requires the relocation of a t-ball field. All of which have an estimated price tag of \$1.5 million based on an estimate previously completed by the City of Arlington Parks and Recreation Department.
Fire	There is zero chance we actually need a new fire station. Our population isn't growing, and fire risk has been steadily declining. On roads I'd rather trust the experts rather than just mention roads near where I live.
Fire	Fire stations 8 and 11 are DISINTEGRATING. They should be replaced before any other 'new' stations are constructed.
