



FLOODPLAIN PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION FY 2022 ANNUAL REPORT AND PROJECT EVALUATION CITY OF ARLINGTON

October 7, 2022

The City of Arlington's Floodplain Program for Public Information Committee (FPPIC) meetings were on February 17, 2022; April 30, 2022; and July 13, 2022. These meetings were used to evaluate, update, and implement outreach projects from the Floodplain Program for Public Information (PPI) Plan. The committee members that attended the FPPIC meetings are provided in the meeting minutes found at www.arlingtontx.gov/fppic.

Throughout FY2022, the FPPIC consisting of following City staff and representatives from the community attended at least one of meetings.

During the development of the Floodplain PPI Plan, the FPPIC identified priority audiences for targeted education projects. These target audiences are as follows:

- The City at large
- Repetitive Flood Loss Areas
- Low water crossing and barricade location area residents and business owners
- Students, faculty, and staff at UTA, TCC and AISD Campuses
- AISD bus drivers and City of Arlington Handitran drivers and Via drivers
- Hospitals, nursing homes, gas well operators and industrial businesses
- Prospective buyers, lenders, real estate agents, mortgage agencies

- All property owners in the floodplain
- City employees and volunteers
- Entertainment District visitors, shortterm rental property owners, businesses, Chamber of Commerce organizations
- City of Arlington Parks and Recreation Facility visitors and park patrons
- Non-SFHA flood-prone area residents and business owners
- Non-English-speaking residents

The Floodplain PPI Plan identifies outreach projects to address the core CRS outreach topics of *Know Your Flood Risk, Promoting Flood Insurance, Protecting People and Property from Flood Hazards, Building Responsibly and Protecting Natural Floodplain Functions.* The FPPIC included four new outreach topics of *Storm Drain Infrastructure, Arlington Watersheds, Guidelines for What to do After a Flood and Diverse Population.*

The City's Floodplain PPI Plan outlines projects that will be developed and implemented over a 5-year period. Stormwater staff works with the FPPIC to prioritize projects for development each year and provides a road map for Stormwater Staff to implement these projects. The Floodplain PPI Plan includes the Flood Insurance Coverage Improvement Plan (CP). Projects for these outreach topics are outlined in the Floodplain PPI and CP Plans which are included in Appendix A and B of this evaluation report.

Stormwater Staff implemented the following projects in FY 2022 from the City's Floodplain PPI Plan and Flood Insurance Coverage Improvement Plan (CP):

- Flood Response Preparation (FRP) Flood Damage Flyer (*PPI Project*) This flyer was added to our Flood Response Preparation packet which is distributed to residents after a flood event has occurred. The flyer provides guidance on what to do if your property floods. Stormwater staff handed out 15 flood response preparation packets.
- Repetitive Loss Annual mailout (*PPI & CP Projects*) Stormwater Staff used the RLAA map to develop the annual mailout to repetitive loss properties within the City. The mailout includes a letter and a copy of the Citizens Guide to Flood Safety and Preparedness brochure. The letter and brochure are reviewed annually. On December 3, 2021, 851 Repetitive Loss letters and Flood Brochures were mailed.
- Mayor Flood Insurance Postcard mailout (*CP Project*) Stormwater staff developed a map of flood prone areas within in the City that are not located in the Special Flood Hazard Area. This map was used to mail the Mayor Flood Insurance Postcard promoting the benefits of purchasing flood insurance to property owners and tenets each year. This project is mailed annually.
- Low Water Crossing/Barricade Location Flood Safety Postcard mailout (*PPI Project*) Stormwater staff developed a map of areas adjacent to low water crossings within the City and Public Works and Transportation Department's Barricade locations. A portion of these locations are mailed a Flood Safety postcard. This postcard informs property owners and tenets about the dangers of low water crossings and the purpose for the barricade locations. 902 postcards were mailed out on July 5, 2021. This project implementation is annually

The Stormwater staff also focused on flood insurance presentation and training opportunities for insurance agents, mortgage companies and other lenders; multi-language outreach; and the development of PSAs. Stormwater staff initiatives included the following:

 Floodplain Management and Flood Insurance Presentation and Training – On January 11, 2022, City staff gave a presentation on Arlington's Floodplain Management program and the Risk Rating 2.0 Flood Insurance changes to the Independent Insurance Agents of Tarrant County. Staff also reached out to several companies that offer Flood Insurance Continuing Education (CE's) for insurance agents to get pricing information. This project will continue through FY 2023.

- The Citizens Guide to Flood Safety and Awareness brochure has been updated to include the new PPI topics: Watersheds and What to do after a flood. The guide is in the process of being translated to Spanish and Vietnamese. The brochure will be used in mailouts, education events and presentations by the Stormwater Education Specialist.
- The Mayor's Flood Insurance postcard and the Low Water Crossing/Barricade Location Flood Safety postcard have been translated into Spanish and Vietnamese. These have been printed with English on one side and the alternate language on the other side. These will be used at education events and presentations by the Stormwater Education Specialist.
- Flood Response Preparation (FRP) notifications that will be used before, during and after a flood event have been created by staff. Graphics for these notifications are still in the process of being designed. These notifications will be disseminated on the City's social media sites and City Hall message boards.
- Illegal Dumping Sign Design was completed. Final design was sent to the FPPIC on August 11, 2022. Locations for the signs will be an FY 2023 project.
- Park Pavilion Rental Pledge The City's Parks & Recreation Department has approved and is in the process of adding the following statement to their rental agreement. "<u>I promise to do my</u> part to Protect Arlington's Parks and Local Waterways by keeping them clean and litter free. I will dispose of trash, litter and food waste in receptacles provided or I will use my own trash bags and dispose of it at home. Since pet waste is a source of bacteria that harms local wildlife and pollutes our local waterways, I will always pick up after my pets and properly dispose of their waste. I will encourage my family and friends to do the same and I will always try to leave this area in a better condition than I found it in." The pledge will be provided in English and Spanish.
- PSA Message Development Stormwater Staff had a meeting with Office of Communications Staff on April 12, 2022, to develop PSA message topics. City staff (Stormwater & Communications) will begin PSA development in FY2023 using Adobe Express. The PSA topics are below:

Based on the FPPIC's evaluation, the current Floodplain PPI Plan covers the anticipated initiatives for informing the targeted audiences and the coverage improvement plan. Currently, there are no changes recommended for the City's current Floodplain PPI Plan this upcoming year.
