

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About the ACS

The American Community Survey (ACS) is the largest demographic survey conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. ACS estimates are based on responses from a sample of household surveys sent ot across the country each year to provide data between the decennial Census. The survey asks questions about jobs, education, homeownership, income, and other topics. Each fall, the Census Bureau releases this data to the public for city officials, planners, and entrepreneurs to assess the current demographics and plan for the future.

The data is released in 1-, 3-, and 5-Year estimates. While 1-year estimates can show a current snapshot of a community, the sample size is smaller and may be less accurate. The City of Arlington uses the 5-Year estimates for research and reporting because the larger sample size used to develop the datasets is considered the most accurate.

About the Socioeconomic Profile

The Arlington Socioeconomic Profile is produced each year upon the release of the new ACS data to provide a comprehensive update of the city's demographics, including population, race and ethnicity, age, gender, educational attainment, and employment metrics. The data is in a comparative format to show how the City has progressed over a 5-10 year period. Showing this data in graphs, tables, and maps makes it easy to understand for policymakers, researchers, and the general public.

In some cases, the best data to support the ACS data is from alternate sources. Throughout the document, these alternate sources are shown as a footnote with an asterisk. Average Arlington Resident

According to the 2022 ACS data, the average Arlington resident is a 33.1 year old woman.

She is non-Hispanic and White, and has at least a high school diploma (or equivalent). She has a 27 minute commute to a job outside of Arlington and lives in a household with an income of \$71,736.



Population by Census Tract




Population has increased by 28,031 since 2010. The average household size in 2022 is 2.8 while the median age is 33.1. Both household size and median age have increased since 2010.

In 2022, the estimated population of Arlington is **393,469**. This is a decrease of 797 from the 2020 Decennial Census estimate of 394,266 but an increase of 1,165 from the 2021 ACS 5-year estimates.

There has been an increase in the percent of population identifying as White (up 1.8% since 2020). Age groups over 65 have increased the most (6.6%) since 2020. On the other end of the age spectrum, the number of children under 5 years old has decreased by 5.4% since 2020.

Unemployment rates dropped back to pre-pandemic levels in 2022. Residents are remain primarily dependent on individual vehicular travel (77.2%) and the average travel times to places of work have slightly decreased since 2020 (26.9 minutes).





Race & Ethnicity

Since 2020, the largest increase in population percentages were those identifying as White (1.8%). Those identifying as Some Other/Multiple Races and Hispanic or Latino both decreased 0.7% from 2020 figures.






Age & Gender

Arlington continues to have increases in older age cohorts with the largest increase since 2020 in 75-79 years (10.7%), 70-74 years (6.4%), and 65-69 years (5.0%). There was also a significant increase in the 40-44 years age cohort (5.6%)

Age cohorts experiencing decreases are slightly more sporadic, with the largest decreases in the 50-54 years age cohort (-6.1%), Under 5 years (-5.4%), and 55-59 years (-4.6%).



Foreign Born Nativity



20.8% of Arlington's population, or approximately 81,995 people, are foreignborn, which is essentially the same as 2021 figures. Nearly half are native to Latin American countries.


Educational Attainment

Arlington's population is achieving higher levels of educational attainment. More residents are acquiring associate, bachelor's, and graduate degrees.


The total number of individuals over 25 years old who have received an advanced degrees has increased by 3.3% (3,221) since 2020.

The median income per household in 2022 was \$71,736. The figure below shows the median household income from 2010-2022 in constant dollars, which adjusts for inflation and compares each year with the dollar having the same purchasing power.

The poverty rate is the percentage of families whose income in the past twelve months is below poverty threshold based on household size.

Arlington's poverty rate has declined 4.5% since 2015 and is at its lowest level since 2010. The poverty rate for the population under 18 years of age is also the lowest it has been since 2010, and decreased 2.6% from 2021.

Occupancy

Since 2020, total occupied units have increased by 1.7% or 2,279 units. The percentage of owner-occupied units has decreased by 0.8% since 2020, despite an overall increase of 102 owner-occupied units.


The percentage of renter-occupied units has increased by the same 0.8% since 2020, with and additional 2,177 renter-occupied units.

Homeownership



Over the past seven years, the average home sale price in Arlington, has exhibited a notable upward trend. The average home sale price was \$192,712 in 2016, while the 2022 average home price in Arlington is \$365,022, far outpacing the increase in median incomes. The average home sale price increased 19% in one year from 2021 to 2022.



Occupations

Since 2020, the total number of jobs has decreased by 0.3%; however, they are back to pre-pandemic levels and have increased 1.3% since 2021. The total number of eligible Arlington residents working has also increased by 2.5% since 2020

Production, transportation, and material moving occupations grew the most since 2020, with an increase of 4.6%. Sales and Office Occupations decreased 5.4%.

The median household income for Arlington households is also increasing. Adjusting for inflation, median household income increased over \$1,000 per household (1.4%) between 2021 and 2022.

Unemployment in Arlington fell to 3.6% in 2022, a 1.8% decline from the 2021 rate. These figures are not from the ACS, but reported monthly by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Top Employers in Arlington continue to provide a significant number of jobs that contribute to the local and global economy, including Arlington ISD, General Motors, UT Arlington, Six Flags Over Texas, and the Texas Rangers among others.

Work Commute

The landscape of commuting to work continues to reflect the changing dynamics of work and transportation. In 2020, 5.7% of individuals reported working from home, which has increased to 9.8% in 2022, most likely due to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. Since 2020, there has also been a slight decrease in the mean travel time to work for Arlington residents.
